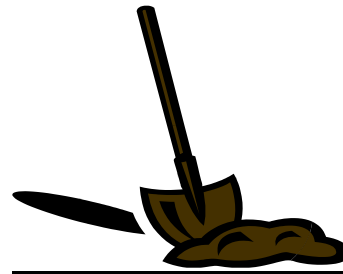


The proposed federal 2010 State Revolving Loan programs are currently being deliberated by Congress. It is anticipated that there will be key differences which will have implications for Maine's water and wastewater systems. It appears likely that there will be increased funding levels. The rehabilitation and replacement of aging infrastructure will specifically be eligible for loans, loan repayment may be extended to 30 years, and it is expected that systems will be required to demonstrate a commitment to financial planning and asset management.

Two morning workshops will be held to discuss these changes. The purpose of the workshops is to update system managers of the anticipated changes, solicit input for SRF program managers to consider as they develop future Intended Use Plans, and generally provide information for system managers, consultants and others who need to be aware of SRF program and other requirements.

The last hour will be a facilitated discussion of topics associated with SRF projects. The focus will be on existing requirements, new provisions inherent in the 2009 ARRA program (Davis-Bacon, Buy American, etc.) and what might be anticipated in the future. This discussion will be guided by a prepared list of questions, issues and solutions. Consultants should come prepared to share their stories, offer advice and provide input that can be considered in the future. System managers should not be shy to relate what is working well for them and what isn't.

Take Exit 182-A onto 395 East. Travel to Exit #5 (Parkway South) and turn left at end of exit. Go 1/10 of a mile over railroad tracks, and take the very next right into the East/West Industrial Park. Travel approximately 100 yards and turn left onto Coffin Avenue. Jeff's Catering is located at 15 Littlefield Way.

From Ellsworth:  
Take 395 West. Travel to Exit #5 (Parkway South) and turn left at end of exit. Go 1/10 of a mile over railroad tracks and take the very next right into the East/West Industrial Park. Travel approximately 100 yards and turn left onto Coffin Avenue. Jeff's Catering is located at 15 Littlefield Way.
